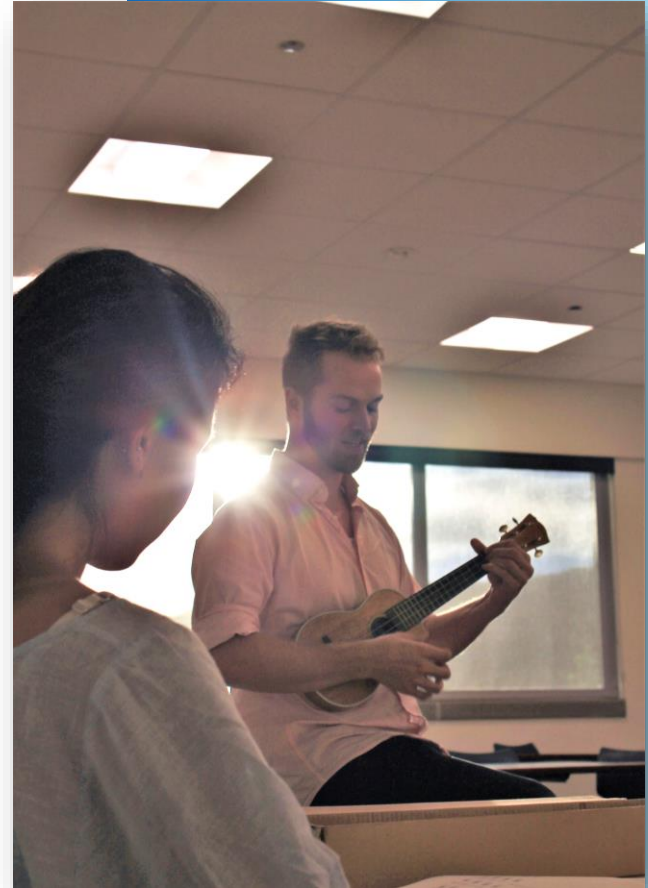

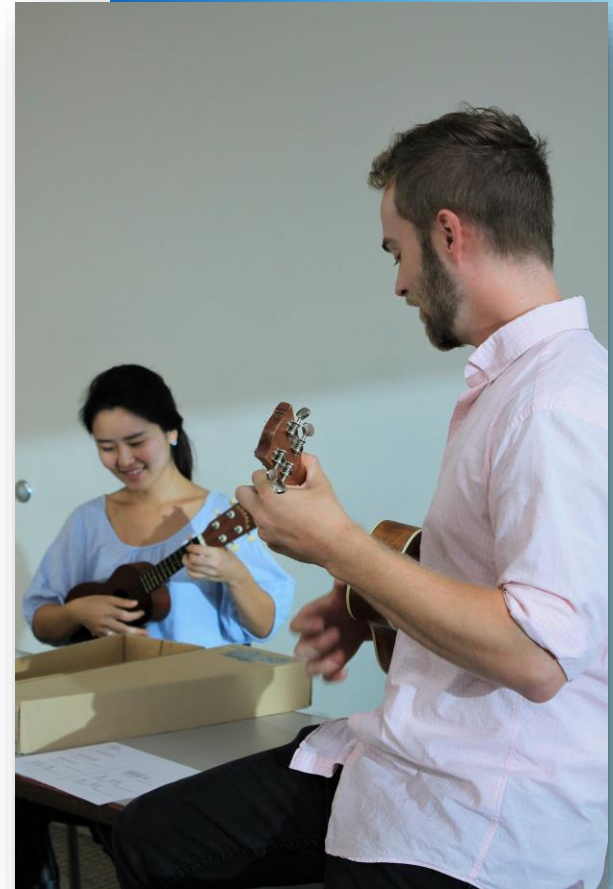

Vision Statement

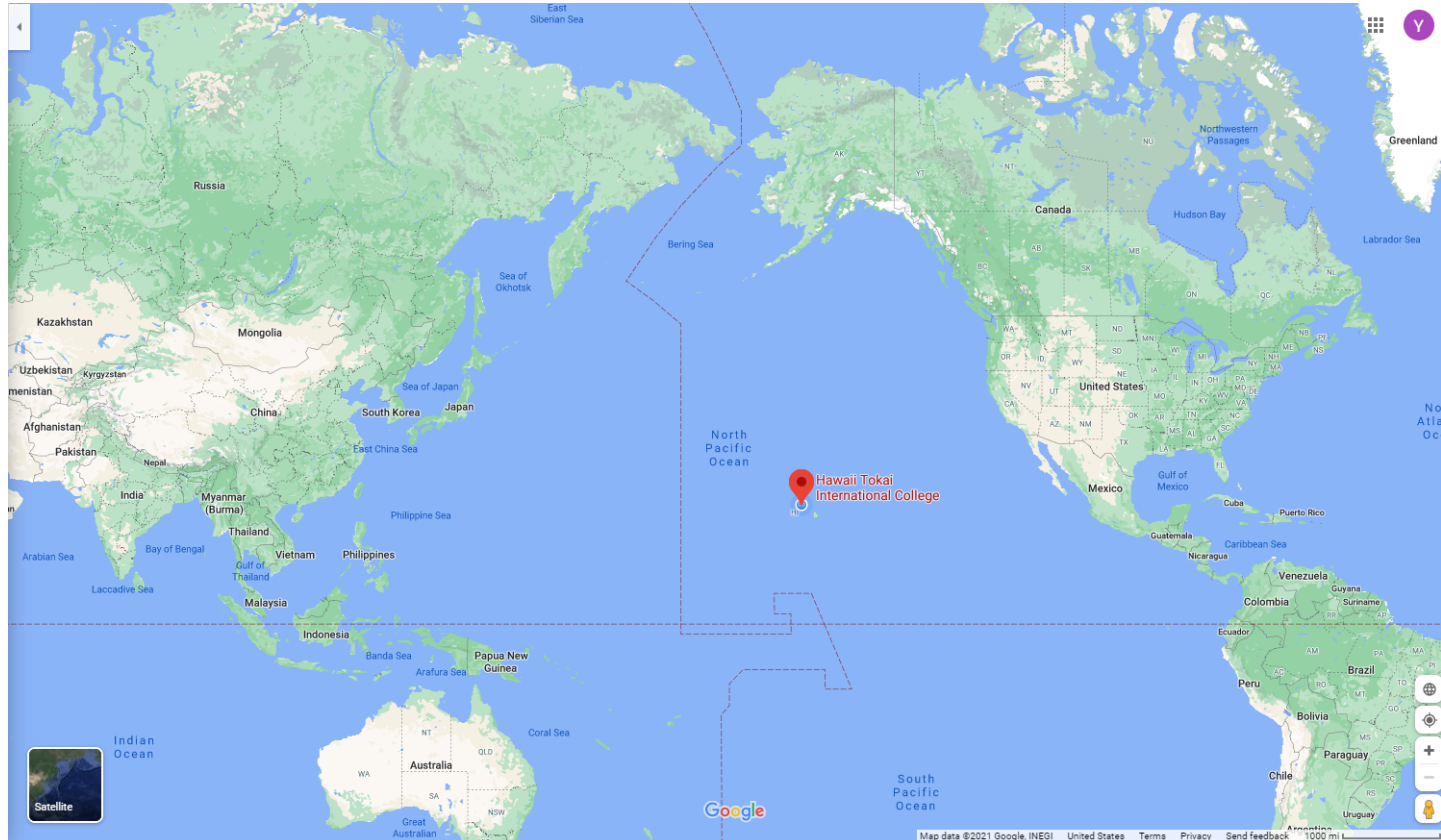
To educate students to become enlightened global citizens who contribute to world peace.

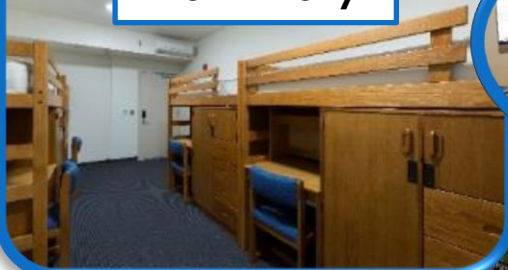

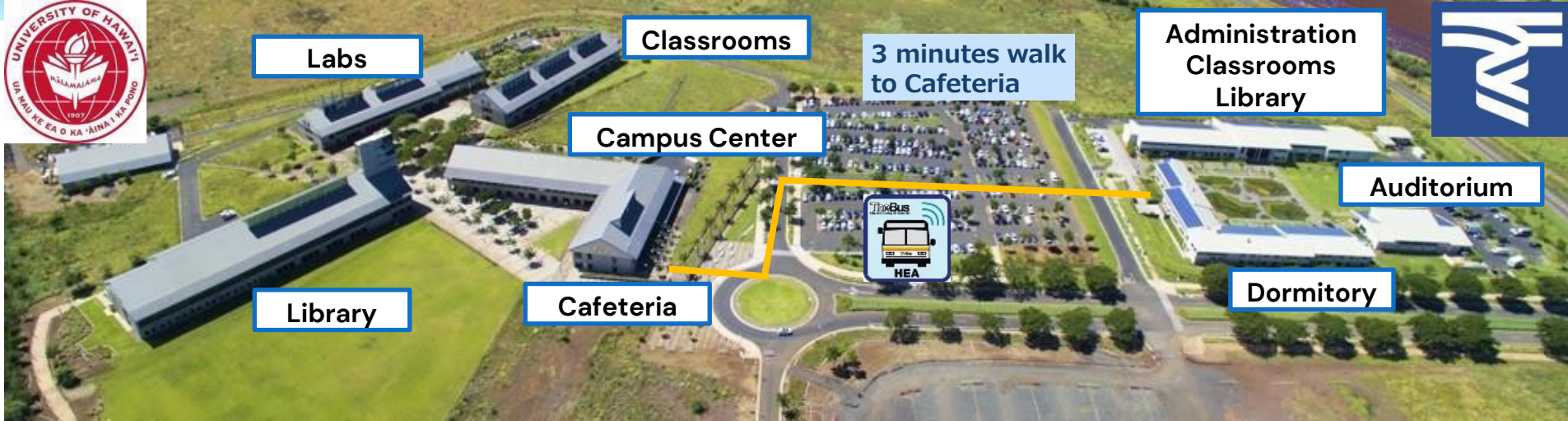

Scholarships

Global Citizen Scholarship for HTIC Students

Applicants must meet the following eligibility criteria to qualify for a tuition scholarship of up to 50% for up to five terms of study at Hawaii Tokai:

- Full-time Liberal Arts (LA) student status at HTIC
- Completion of one full term as an L.A. student (completed at least 11 credits and ENG 100)
- Have a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher
- Participation in at least 10 hours of volunteer community service in current term
- Adherence to the HTIC Student Code of Conduct
